

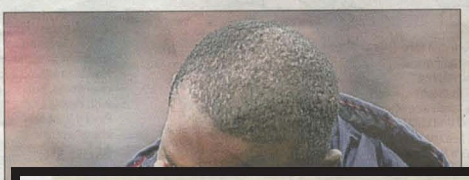

ROAD TEST INTRACEUTICALS OXYGEN INFUSION FACIAL

What: Clear skin is the only way to face summer. Intraceuticals' facial uses pressurised therapeutic-grade oxygen to deliver tailored serums including moisture-retaining hylauronic acid into the skin. While most creams simply sit on the skin's surface, which is effective at the time but fails to tackle the causes of dry skin, Intraceuticals plumps skin from inside out. Celebrity patronage is huge. Madonna has an infusion machine in each of her three homes, while Naomi Campbell, Miranda Kerr and Bar Rafaeli are all fans.

We like: The instant results. After cleansing, Intraceuticals' head of education, Sharon Oldham, runs a pen-like wand over the face. After five

minutes, she demonstrates the 'half face' test when she invites clients to see the difference between treated and untreated skin. The silhouette is immediately plumper, skin more flexible. There are four serums – for anti-ageing, re-firming, brightening and clarity.

We didn't like: For about 30 seconds, the sensation is disconcerting. And the price is hefty.
Where: 60 min/£125. Course of six: £750 (including £275 of products).
